15 arrested in suspected £30m VAT fraud investigation

Fifteen men have been arrested across the country as part of an investigation into a suspected £30 million VAT fraud linked to the electronic communications industry.

Officers from HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) made the arrests during raids yesterday morning in Stoke, London, Glasgow, Bristol, Birmingham, Newcastle upon Tyne, Derby, Manchester and Scunthorpe. Raids were also carried out in Cyprus at the same time.

Around 240 HMRC officers searched 24 residential and business premises in the UK and seized business accounts and computers.

Paul Barton, Assistant Director Criminal Investigation, HMRC, said:

"We are investigating what we believe to be a large-scale, organised VAT fraud extending across the UK and abroad. The operation today sends out a clear message that we will relentlessly pursue those suspected to be involved in tax fraud.

"Anyone with information about people or businesses they suspect might be involved in tax fraud can report it by calling the HMRC 24-hour tax evasion hotline on 0800 59 5000."

All 15 men are being interviewed.
